Natalia Greene, born in Quito-Ecuador, graduated at Hampshire College (Amherst-MA) and holds a Political Science Master's Degree from FLACSO-Ecuador and a specialization in Climate Change from Universidad Andina Simón Bolívar (UASB-Ecuador). She is currently attending a Master Degree in Climate Change and Sustainable Development at UASB. Holds a Political Science Diplomat from Institut d'Etudes Politiques Paris. She promoted the recognition of Rights of Nature in Ecuador's Constitution and has worked as a consultant on the environmental and indigenous aspects of the Yasuní-ITT Initiative to keep oil underground in the Amazon. From 2011-2014, Natalia Greene was the President of CEDENMA, the National Coordinating Entity for Environmental NGO's, and is currently the Program Coordinator for CEDENMA, leading the National Climate Justice Platform. She is an Energy Efficiency Professor at UASB and a consultant, and former Coordinator for UISA (Socio Environmental Research Unit – UASB). She has worked in Ecuador with CEDENMA, Fundación Pachamama and Yasunidos to implement Rights of Nature Constitutional guarantees and protect biodiverse regions such as Yasuní and the Condor Highland. She is the focal point for Rights of Nature in Ecuador for the Global Alliance for the Rights of Nature and has been the Secretariat for the International Rights of Nature Tribunals.
