

Delphine Batho

Delphine Batho is a Member of Parliament since 2007. She was Minister of the Ecology, Sustainable Development and Energy from 2012 to 2013. She is the President of Génération Ecologie since September 2018.



She was very committed to voluntary activities, one of her first commitments date back to her adolescence for the "School Action" Campaign of the NGO Médecin du Monde. She was president of the FIDL (International Federation of Human Right) high school union from 1990 to 1992, then vice-president of the NGO SOS Racisme from 1992 to 1998.

In her professional life, she worked from 1999 to 2007 as a specialist in security and fight against violence policies. During the 2012 presidential campaign, she was one of the four spokespersons for the candidate François Hollande.

Today, in the National Assembly, she is a member of the Economic Affairs Committee and she is particularly involved in issues related to ecology, energy, agricultural and industrial policies, as well as in the moralization of public life and the fight against the influence of lobbies.

Following the "dieselgate", she was rapporteur for a fact-finding mission of the National Assembly and published the report "Ecologie-Automobile : une alliance française".

Delphine Batho is the author of "Insoumise" (Grasset, October 2014) in which she shares her experience as a Minister. In her book, she describes the functioning of the State, connivance with lobbies and financial powers. She also affirms its ecological and economic convictions.

She recently published "Écologie intégrale, le Manifeste" (Éditions du Rocher, January 2019) in which she presents the thought of the Integral Ecology (écologie intégrale), an ecological political project. Faced with the legitimate fear caused by the destruction of nature, Integral Ecology wants to restore meaning to our lives: we are natural beings rooted in the living. It is our harmony with all living things that can allow us to lift mountains and bring down the ancient order of the Destroyers.
